ABOUT THE ACT

The ACT is a nationally administered, standardized test that helps colleges evaluate candidates.

FEATURES

There are 4 sections on this multiple-choice test - English, Mathematics, Reading & Science - and an optional Essay.* The test takes 2 hrs 55 mins (plus 40 mins for the Essay). Scores range between 1 and 36.

*Though optional, we tell our students to write the essay every time.

DIFFERENCE from the SAT

The SAT and ACT are different tests, and measure different skills. Below is some of their differences.

Order of Sections: ACT - 1st English, then Math, Reading & Science. SAT - 1st Reading, then Writing/Language, Math No Calculator, Math With Calculator.

Math: The ACT includes 1 section of math while the SAT has 2 sections (1 with a calculator and 1 without). Also the SAT math sections include multiple choice and free response questions while all questions on the ACT are multiple choice.

Content: The ACT includes a science section, but the SAT does not.

Timing: There are far more questions in each section of the ACT than the SAT which means students can spend less time per question on the ACT

SHOULD I TAKE THE ACT?

Since the SAT and ACT reward different attributes, performing well on each test depends on what kind of test-taker you are. Here are some factors that may help you decide:

What type of student are you? Students who like tests that are straight-forward and similar to a high school final may prefer the ACT. While students who have deep understanding of subject mater and prefer more in-depth questioning may prefer the SAT.

Which format would you prefer? The SAT has fewer questions, but they typically require more work. The ACT is a fast paced test requiring fast reading skills but less work is needed per question.

What level of math do you take in school? Both the SAT and ACT require more advanced math topics, including elements of pre-calculus and trigonometry.

We recommend that you take a simulated ACT & SAT to help you make a more educated decision.

These one-to-one private sessions for the ACT offer the student the ability to progress at his or her own pace while building a trusting and comfortable rapport with the tutor. Students are recommended to take simulated practice ACT about 3 weeks before test day to assess their progress.

We recommend at least 16-20 hours of prep for the first ACT and 8 hours of refreshers for additional tests.

Small Groups

\$1400/student

This is an intensive 8-week course aimed at identifying and correcting weaknesses in a student's performance. Students meet twice a week, for both math/science and English (2 hours for each class). Classes are kept small (max 6 students) to enable students to get enough personal attention to master the methods and strategies. Students are administered a simulated practice ACT to assess their progress.

MATH	Measures math skills in Algebra I&II, Geometry & Trigonometry	60 mins
READING	Measures reading comprehension	35 mins
SCIENCE	Measures the interpretation, analysis, evaluation, reasoning and problem-solving skills required in natural sciences	35 mins
